Criteria for assessment

The following elements will be taken into account in the assessment of the coursework:

 Correct identification of the relevant legal and policy issues arising from the essay question

- Demonstration of ability to carry out independent research and to apply independent, critical thinking to the question(s) at hand
- Accurate analysis of the question(s) at hand, with application of statutory law and judicial decisions, as well as with reference to academic and professional literature and other sources of information
- Presentation of the argument in a clear, logical and coherent manner
- Correct referencing to all sources cited or referred to in the coursework, using the appropriate referencing system.

No marks will be allocated or deducted for writing style. You may present your argument in the way that best conveys your ability to analyse and apply your knowledge, understanding, and research.

SUBMISSION DETAILS

Word limit: **2,000**-word essay (+/- 10% without penalty) footnotes included. Bibliography does not contribute to the final word count.

10% more or less than the word limit is acceptable. More or less than 10% deviance will be penalized by 1 mark for every 200 words in excess or deficit of the word limit.
