REL 11 Research Paper Fall 2022

Your assignment is to research and report on the origin, history, and significance of a particular ritual in a religious tradition (not your own) conducted in Los Angeles and compare it with another religious ritual tradition (not your own).

If physical/social distancing permits,* this requires: a *documented* site visit (which may be a photograph [a selfie is fine] taken during your visit appended to your paper *or* incorporated within the text) and participatory observation of a service, be it prayer, meditation, worship, or communal celebration.

This paper assignment only requires participatory observation during *one* site visit, but I will consider giving extra credit to projects that incorporate *two* site visits and/or those which conduct documented and transcribed interviews with a representative member of the religious community in question.

Papers should be no less than 10 pages (not including a title page or bibliography) and include at least five scholarly sources (two of which can be from course readings). A peer-reviewed scholarly source is either published in a journal or book. Paper formatting: Double-spaced, Times New Roman, in 12 point font, using *Chicago Style* guidelines, footnotes, and a bibliography.
